We acknowledge receipt of your application for an Environmental Compliance Approval dated October 29, 2018 and received on November 26, 2018 for approval under Part II.1 of the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. E. 19 (EPA).

A preliminary review of your above-noted application indicates that you are seeking approval to engage in an activity of the type that must be registered in the Environmental Activity and Sector Registry (EASR). Unless a circumstance set out in section 2(2) of O. Reg. 1/17 exists at or in respect of the facility, the activities with air emissions must be registered in the EASR. The EASR is established under the EPA, and is an on-line self-registration tool in which persons who are proposing to engage in an activity prescribed for the purposes of subsection 20.21 (1) of the EPA must register the activity.

Ontario Regulation 245/11: Registrations Under Part II.2 Of The Act – General contains requirements on the information that is to be filed in the EASR, and the following regulation prescribes activities for the purposes of subsection 20.21 (1) of the EPA:

Ontario Regulation 1/17: Registrations Under Part II.2 of the Act – Activities Requiring Assessment of Air Emissions

Since your application involves only activities that are required to be registered in the EASR (i.e., prescribed activities) you are required to complete the on-line registration process. You do not

need to obtain an ECA in respect of these activities from the Director. Once you have registered the activities in the EASR, you will receive a confirmation of registration from the Director. Businesses register prescribed activities on-line in the EASR, through the Service Ontario portal at www.ServiceOntario.ca.

Please note that you are required to register a prescribed activity in the EASR before engaging in it, and are required to engage in the activity in accordance with the operating requirements set out in the regulations for that activity. It is a contravention of subsection 20.21(1) of the EPA to proceed with the activities prescribed by regulations without first registering the activities in the EASR.

Also note that the ministry will conduct pro-active inspections on facilities that register or are eligible for the EASR, as well as continue addressing reported incidents/complaints at the facilities. The ministry will also conduct pro-active audits to validate completed assessments of any air, noise or odour emissions to ensure they meet the EASR requirements. The regulation contains specific record-keeping requirements.

Your application, including the submitted application fee deducted by the administrative fee will be returned to you.

With respect to activities that are not required to be registered in the EASR, you are reminded that, under section 20.2 of Part II.1 of the EPA, you are required to obtain an approval under section 20.3 of Part II.1 of the Act before engaging in any activity mentioned in subsection 9 (1) or 27 (1) of the EPA or subsection 53 (1) of the Ontario Water Resources Act (OWRA).

FACT SHEET

How to Register Using the Air Emissions Environmental Activity and Sector Registration

A new online registration process for facilities with air emissions is effective on January 31, 2017. Eligible businesses are now required to obtain an Environmental Activity and Sector Registration (EASR). EASR is an online registration process for routine activities and sectors.

EASR makes it easier for businesses to register by:

- eliminating administrative burdens
- making the process faster, transparent, and more accessible
- potentially reducing costs through a one-time fee

Follow these steps to register for the proposed Air Emissions EASR:

1. Determine if your business/activities would be eligible

- For a list of eligible activities, see the Air Emissions EASR regulation (O. Reg. 1/17) posted on Ontario's e-Laws site (https://www.ontario.ca/laws/regulation/r17001).
- Facilities with air emissions that meet the criteria in the Air Emissions EASR regulation are able to register activities under the new EASR, with some exceptions.

2. Gather the required information to prepare your submission

The following information is required prior to registering a new or existing facility or making any modifications:

- The review and/or completion of assessments of any air, noise or odour emissions from the facility
- Confirmation that the reports are in compliance with the regulation and guidelines by a licensed engineering practitioner.
- Operating procedures and maintenance programs for sources of contaminants.

O. Reg. 1/17 Requirements

Air Emissions

- EASR ESDM (Environmental Activity and Sector Registry Emission Summary and Dispersion Modelling) report prepared in accordance with O. Reg. 419/05 using one or more approved dispersion models
- EASR ESDM report must be accompanied by an EASR ESDM report supplement
- Best Management Practices Plan for fugitive dust (if applicable)
- Statement verifying each piece of combustion equipment (boiler or heater, electricity generation engine, or small wood fired combustor) meets in-stack limits

Noise Emissions

- Assessment of noise emissions using the Primary or Secondary Noise Screening Method or an acoustic assessment
- A noise abatement action plan may be included in a noise report if the facility commenced operation before January 31, 2017 and noise emissions exceed applicable sound level limits (see NPC-300)
- Acoustic summary table (if an acoustic assessment was prepared) submitted electronically with registration

Odour Emissions

- An odour screening report
- ➤ If screening report confirms circumstances as set out in O. Reg. 1/17, a Best Management Practices Plan for Odour and/or Odour Control Report must be prepared



3. Complete your registration online

Visit <u>www.ontario.ca/page/environmental-activity-and-sector-registry</u> to find out how to set-up your account and register for an EASR online. You can set-up your account now. If you are a new registrant you will need to pay a one-time registration fee of \$2,353.

Additional Information

Proposed Exemptions

The ministry has consulted on proposed amendments to the <u>Environmental Compliance Approvals</u> <u>Exemption regulation</u> (EBR # 012-8764) to exempt the following activities from applying for an environmental compliance approval or registering on the Environmental Activity and Sector Registry:

- Equipment used at Public and Private Schools (primary and secondary);
- Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC) Systems;
- Standby Power Systems; and,
- Comfort Heating Systems Small Wood Fired Combustors (rated at 50kW or less).

The exemptions would reduce the regulatory burden on less complex activities whose emissions do not pose a significant risk to human health or the environment. The types of facilities where these activities typically occur include office buildings, apartment buildings and public and private schools.

If you are transitioning from an ECA to an EASR

Environmental Compliance Approval (ECA) applicants who submitted an application on or before December 31, 2016 have the option to remain in the ECA process or withdraw and register on the EASR. If you choose to remain in the ECA process you have to register by 2027 or when a facility modification occurs.

The regulation comes into force on January 31, 2017, at which point businesses can begin registering their activities under the new Air Emissions EASR. After this date new and existing facilities that make modifications are required to register their activities under the Air Emissions EASR.

Further, by January 31, 2027 an existing ECA issued for any activity to which the regulation is applicable will cease to apply.

Compliance requirements for EASRs

Ministry staff will conduct proactive inspections on facilities that register or are eligible for the EASR, as well as continue addressing reported incidents/complaints at the facilities. The ministry will conduct pro-active audits to validate completed assessments of any air, noise or odour emissions to ensure they meet the EASR requirements. The regulation contains specific record-keeping requirements.
