You have applied under section 20.2 of Part II.1 of the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. E. 19 (Environmental Protection Act) for approval of:

- one (1) wood chipper, operated at the Facility by a third-party crusher/screening operator, and processing a maximum 200 tonnes per day of wood waste;
- outdoor storage piles (storing a combined total of 4,050 cubic metres of sorted recyclable materials);
  - wood;
  - recyclable materials paper, plastic, and cardboard;
  - asphalt;
  - concrete:
  - brick/block;
- one (1) clean fill/soil storage pile (located adjacent to the property line at the rear of 49 Milvan Drive);
- one (1) stationary screening and sorting system (SSSS), equipped with a trommel screen to remove smaller particles, and screening a maximum of 990 tonnes per day of waste material;
- fugitive emissions associated with the delivery, storage, and transfer of waste materials at the Facility;

all in accordance with the Application for Approval (Air & Noise) submitted by SEJJ Environmental Solutions Inc., dated December 14, 2018, and signed by John Rossi, President; and the supporting information, including the Emission Summary and Dispersion Modelling Report, submitted by Airzone One Ltd., dated December 14, 2018, and signed by Nicole Shantz, the Acoustic Assessment Report prepared by Valcoustics Canada Ltd. dated October 11, 2019 and signed by Guangsheng (Sam)

Du, P. Eng.; and the additional information submitted by Airzone One Ltd., dated June 24, 2019 (sent via e-mail by Roy Sabbino), October 25, 2019 (sent via e-mail by Jessica Knox), November 13, 2019 (sent via e-mail by Jessica Knox and Roger Rambhajan), and November 14 (sent via e-mail by Roger Rambhajan).

For the purpose of this environmental compliance approval, the following definitions apply:

- 1. "Approval" means this Environmental Compliance Approval, including the application and supporting documentation listed above;
- 2. "Best Management Practices Plan" means the document titled "Best Management Practices Plan (BMPP) for Dust", dated November 2019, and prepared by Airzone One Ltd., as amended;
- 3. "Company" means SEJJ Environmental Solutions Inc., that is responsible for the construction or operation of the Facility and includes any successors and assigns;
- 4. "District Manager" means the District Manager of the appropriate local district office of the Ministry, where the Facility is geographically located;
- 5. "*EPA*" means the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.E.19, as amended ;
- 6. "Equipment" means the equipment and processes described in the Company's application, this Approval and in the supporting documentation submitted with the application, to the extent approved by this Approval;
- 7. "Facility" means the entire operation located on the property where the Equipment is located, including operations associated with the Clean Fill/Soil storage pile located at the rear of 49 Milvan Drive;
- 8. "*Manual*" means a document or a set of documents that provide written instructions to staff of the *Company*;
- 9. "Ministry" means the ministry of the government of Ontario responsible for the *EPA* and includes all officials, employees or other persons acting on its behalf; and
- 10. "Publication NPC-300" means the *Ministry* Publication NPC-300, "Environmental Noise Guideline, Stationary and Transportation Sources Approval and Planning, Publication NPC-300", August 2013, as amended.

You are hereby notified that this environmental compliance approval is issued to you subject to the terms and conditions outlined below:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

#### 1. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

- 1. The *Company* shall ensure that the *Equipment* is properly operated and maintained at all times. The *Company* shall:
  - a. prepare, not later than three (3) months after the date of this *Approval*, and update, as necessary, a *Manual* outlining the operating procedures and a maintenance program for the *Equipment*, including:
    - i. routine operating and maintenance procedures in accordance with good engineering practices and as recommended by the Equipment suppliers;
    - ii. emergency procedures, including spill clean-up procedures;
    - iii. procedures for any record keeping activities relating to operation and maintenance of the *Equipment*;
    - iv. all appropriate measures to minimize noise and odorous emissions from all potential sources; and
    - v. the frequency of inspection of the Stationary Screening and Sorting System (SSSS);
  - b. implement the recommendations of the Manual.

### 2. FUGITIVE DUST CONTROL

- 1. The *Company* shall implement the *Best Management Practices Plan* for the control of fugitive dust emissions resulting from the operation of the *Facility* upon issuance of this *Approval*.
- 2. The *Company* shall prepare, in consultation with the *District Manager*, an updated *Best Management Practices Plan*, not later than three (3) months after the date of this *Approval*, and update the *Best Management Practices Plan*, as necessary, or at the direction of the *District Manager*.

#### 3. RECORD RETENTION

- 1. The *Company* shall retain, for a minimum of two (2) years from the date of their creation, all records and information related to or resulting from the recording activities required by this *Approval*, and make these records available for review by staff of the *Ministry* upon request. The *Company* shall retain:
  - a. all records on the maintenance, repair and inspection of the *Equipment*; and
  - b. all records of any environmental complaints, including:
    - i. a description, time and date of each incident to which the complaint relates;

- ii. wind direction at the time of the incident to which the complaint relates; and
- iii. a description of the measures taken to address the cause of the incident to which the complaint relates and to prevent a similar occurrence in the future.

#### 4. NOTIFICATION OF COMPLAINTS

- 1. The *Company* shall notify the *District Manager*, in writing, of each environmental complaint within two (2) business days of the complaint. The notification shall include:
  - a. a description of the nature of the complaint;
  - b. the time and date of the incident to which the complaint relates;
  - c. wind direction at the time of the incident to which the complaint relates; and
  - d. a description of the measures taken to address the cause of the incident to which the complaint relates and to prevent a similar occurrence in the future.

#### 5. NOISE

1. The *Company* shall, at all times, ensure that the noise emissions from the *Facility* comply with the limits set in *Ministry Publication NPC-300*.

The reasons for the imposition of these terms and conditions are as follows:

- 1. Conditions No. 1 and 2 are included to emphasize that the *Equipment* must be maintained and operated according to a procedure that will result in compliance with the *EPA*, the Regulations and this *Approval*.
- 2. Condition No. 3 is included to require the *Company* to keep records and to provide information to staff of the *Ministry* so that compliance with the *EPA*, the Regulations and this *Approval* can be verified.
- 3. Condition No. 4 is included to require the *Company* to notify staff of the *Ministry* so as to assist the *Ministry* with the review of the site's compliance.
- 4. Condition No. 5 is included to provide the minimum performance requirements considered necessary to prevent an adverse effect resulting from the operation of the *Facility*.

In accordance with Section 139 of the Environmental Protection Act, you may by written

Notice served upon me, the Environmental Review Tribunal and in accordance with Section 47 of the Environmental Bill of Rights, 1993, the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks, within 15 days after receipt of this Notice, require a hearing by the Tribunal. The Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks will place notice of your appeal on the Environmental Registry. Section 142 of the Environmental Protection Act provides that the Notice requiring the hearing shall state:

- a. The portions of the environmental compliance approval or each term or condition in the environmental compliance approval in respect of which the hearing is required, and;
- b. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to each portion appealed.

#### The Notice should also include:

- 1. The name of the appellant;
- 2. The address of the appellant;
- 3. The environmental compliance approval number;
- 4. The date of the environmental compliance approval;
- 5. The name of the Director, and;
- 6. The municipality or municipalities within which the project is to be engaged in.

And the Notice should be signed and dated by the appellant.
