This work is ordered pursuant to my authority under cl. 18 (1) para 7 of Environmental Protection Act. I am of the opinion that the plan required by this Director's Order is reasonable and justified in the circumstances for the purpose of addressing ongoing non-compliance and the potential adverse impacts to the environment.

Part 2: Work Ordered

Item No. 1	Compliance Date	2021/12/31
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The Company shall provide the undersigned Director a plan to come into compliance with section 20 of Ontario Regulation 419/05.

The plan shall include but not necessarily be limited to the following:

- a) Applying for new site-specific standards for benzo(a)pyrene, benzene and suspended particulate matter for an annual averaging period.
- b) The plan shall include a description of the public consultation that will be undertaken in respect to the application.
- c) The date, no later than March 31, 2022, by which the application shall be submitted under s. 32 of Ontario Regulation 419/05.

By February 28, 2022, the Company shall complete one public meeting on the intended applications for a benzo[a]pyrene, benzene and suspended particulate matter site-specific standards, and shall comply with the requirements set out in subsections 34(2) to 34(4) of O.Reg 419/05 in respect of the public meeting.

- A. While this Order is in effect, a copy or copies of this order shall be posted in a conspicuous place.
- B. While this Order is in effect, report in writing, to the District or Area office, any significant changes of operation, emission, ownership, tenancy or other legal status of the facility or operation.
- C. Unless otherwise specified, all requirements of this Order are effective upon service of this Order.
