You have applied under section 20.2 of Part II.1 of the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. E. 19 (Environmental Protection Act) for approval of:

a facility producing flour tortillas and English muffins at a maximum combined production rate of 2,942 kilograms per hour, comprising the following equipment;

- one (1) natural gas fired water heater (source DHWT1 Water Heater), having a maximum heat input of 400,900 kilojoules per hour, discharging into the air through a stack, having an exit diameter of 0.15 metre, extending 1.0 metre above the roof and 9.0 metres above grade;
- one (1) natural gas fired water heater (source DHWT5 Water Heater), having a maximum heat input of 94,950 kilojoules per hour, discharging into the air through as stack, having an exit diameter of 0.15 metre, extending 1.0 metre above the roof and 9.0 metres above grade;
- one (1) natural gas fired air make-up unit (source MUA1 Unit Heater), having a maximum heat input of 5,975,520 kilojoules per hour, discharging into the air through a stack, having an exit diameter of 0.10 metre, extending 1.3 metres above the roof and 9.3 metres above grade;
- one (1) natural gas fired air make-up unit (source MUA2 Unit Heater), having a maximum heat input of 1,991,840 kilojoules per hour, discharging into the air through a stack, having an exit diameter of 0.10 metre, extending 1.3 metres above the roof and 9.3 metres above grade;
- one (1) natural gas fired bake oven (source S6, Mega Flour Line), having a maximum heat input of 1,582,420 kilojoules per hour, discharging into the air through a stack, having an exit diameter of 0.51 metre, extending 2.1 metres above the roof and 10.1 metres above grade;
- one (1) natural gas fired bake oven (source S10, Double Drop Flour), having a maximum heat input

of 2,531,870 kilojoules per hour, discharging into the air through a stack, having an exit diameter of 0.54 metre, extending 1.7 metres above the roof and 9.7 metres above grade;

- one (1) natural gas fired bake oven (source S49, English Muffin Oven), having a maximum heat input of 2,994,090 kilojoules per hour, discharging into the air through a stack, having an exit diameter of 0.59 metre, extending 1.8 metres above the roof and 9.8 metres above grade;
- one (1) natural gas fired boiler (source S02, Fulton Boiler), having a maximum heat input of 883,560 kilojoules per hour, discharging into the air through a stack, having an exit diameter of 0.57 metre, extending 1.4 metres above the roof and 9.4 metres above grade;
- (1) natural gas fired boiler (source S22, Fulton Boiler), having a maximum heat input of 420,950 kilojoules per hour, discharging into the air through a stack, having an exit diameter of 0.89 metre, extending 1.4 metres above the roof and 9.4 metres above grade;
- one (1) general exhaust system (source S07, Round General Ventilation Unit (for Inks)), discharging into the air at a nominal volumetric flow rate of 9.5 actual cubic metres per second through a stack, having an exit diameter of 1.4 metres, extending 1.2 metres above the roof and 9.2 metres above grade;
- one (1) general exhaust system (source S21, Maintenance Welding Exhaust), discharging into the air at a nominal volumetric flow rate of 0.25 actual cubic metre per second through a stack, having an exit diameter of 0.16 metre, extending 1.4 metres above the roof and 9.4 metres above grade;
- one (1) flour silo, (source 51, Flour Silo Whole Wheat), equipped with a in type vent filter, discharging into the air through a stack, having an exit diameter of 0.28 metre, extending 8.2 metres above the roof and 16.2 metres above grade;
- one (1) flour silo, (source 52, Flour Silo White), equipped with a in type vent filter, discharging into the air through a stack, having an exit diameter of 0.28 metre, extending 8.2 metres above the roof and 16.2 metres above grade;
- seven (7) general exhaust (sources S08, S14, S23, S25, S38, S39 and S50, serving production area;natural gas fired comfort heating equipment;

all in accordance with the Environmental Compliance Approval Application submitted by Weston Foods (Canada) Inc., dated August 24, 2020 and signed by John Cummings, Director of Environmental, Health and Safety; the Emission Summary and Dispersion Modelling Report dated August 7, 2020 prepared by Brad Bergeron (RWDI AIR Inc.); the email from Brad Bergeron (RWDI AIR Inc.) dated December 22, 2021; the Primary Noise Screening Method dated July 24, 2019 and signed by Gillian Redman (RWDI), and all supporting information associated with the application.

For the purpose of this environmental compliance approval, the following definitions apply:

1. "Approval" means this Environmental Compliance Approval, including the application and supporting documentation listed above;
2. "Company" means Weston Foods (Canada) Inc. operating as Weston Foods (Canada) Inc. that is responsible for the construction or operation of the Facility and includes any successors and assigns

in accordance with section 19 of the EPA;

3. "District Manager" means the District Manager of the appropriate local district office of the Ministry, where the Facility is geographically located;
4. "EPA" means the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.E.19;
5. "Equipment" means the equipment described in the Company's application, this Approval and in the supporting documentation submitted with the application, to the extent approved by this Approval;
6. "Facility" means the entire operation located on the property where the Equipment is located;
7. "Manual" means a document or a set of documents that provide written instructions to staff of the Company;
8. "Ministry" means the ministry of the government of Ontario responsible for the EPA and includes all officials, employees or other persons acting on its behalf;
9. "Publication NPC-300" means the Ministry Publication NPC-300, "Environmental Noise Guideline, Stationary and Transportation Sources – Approval and Planning, Publication NPC-300", August 2013, as amended.

You are hereby notified that this environmental compliance approval is issued to you subject to the terms and conditions outlined below:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

1. The Company shall ensure that the Equipment is properly operated and maintained at all times. The Company shall:
 - a. prepare, not later than three (3) months after the date of this Approval, and update, as necessary, a Manual outlining the operating procedures and a maintenance program for the Equipment, including:
 - i. routine operating and maintenance procedures in accordance with good engineering practices and as recommended by the Equipment suppliers;
 - ii. emergency procedures;
 - iii. procedures for any record keeping activities relating to operation and maintenance of the Equipment;

- iv. all appropriate measures to minimize noise and odorous emissions from all potential sources; and
 - v. the frequency of inspection and replacement of the filter material in the Equipment;
- b. implement the recommendations of the Manual.

2. RECORD RETENTION

1. The Company shall retain, for a minimum of two (2) years from the date of their creation, all records and information related to or resulting from the recording activities required by this Approval, and make these records available for review by staff of the Ministry upon request. The Company shall retain:
 - a. all records on the maintenance, repair and inspection of the Equipment; and
 - b. all records of any environmental complaints, including:
 - i. a description, time and date of each incident to which the complaint relates;
 - ii. wind direction at the time of the incident to which the complaint relates; and
 - iii. a description of the measures taken to address the cause of the incident to which the complaint relates and to prevent a similar occurrence in the future.

3. NOTIFICATION OF COMPLAINTS

1. The Company shall notify the District Manager, in writing, of each environmental complaint within two (2) business days of the complaint. The notification shall include:
 - a. a description of the nature of the complaint; and
 - b. the time and date of the incident to which the complaint relates.

4. NOISE

1. The Company shall, at all times, ensure that the noise emissions from the Facility comply with the limits set out in Ministry Publication NPC-300.

The reasons for the imposition of these terms and conditions are as follows:

1. Condition No. 1 is included to emphasize that the Equipment must be maintained and operated according to a procedure that will result in compliance with the EPA, the Regulations and this

Approval.

2. Condition No. 2 is included to require the Company to keep records and to provide information to staff of the Ministry so that compliance with the EPA, the Regulations and this Approval can be verified.
3. Condition No. 3 is included to require the Company to notify staff of the Ministry so as to assist the Ministry with the review of the site's compliance.
4. Condition No. 4 is included to provide the minimum performance requirements considered necessary to prevent an adverse effect resulting from the operation of the Facility.

In accordance with Section 139 of the *Environmental Protection Act*, you may by written notice served upon me, the Ontario Land Tribunal and in accordance with Section 47 of the *Environmental Bill of Rights*, 1993, the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks, within 15 days after receipt of this notice, require a hearing by the Tribunal. The Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks will place notice of your appeal on the Environmental Registry. Section 142 of the *Environmental Protection Act* provides that the notice requiring the hearing ("the Notice") shall state:

- a. The portions of the environmental compliance approval or each term or condition in the environmental compliance approval in respect of which the hearing is required, and;
- b. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to each portion appealed.

Pursuant to subsection 139(3) of the *Environmental Protection Act*, a hearing may not be required with respect to any terms and conditions in this environmental compliance approval, if the terms and conditions are substantially the same as those contained in an approval that is amended or revoked by this environmental compliance approval.

The Notice should also include:

1. The name of the appellant;
2. The address of the appellant;
3. The environmental compliance approval number;
4. The date of the environmental compliance approval;
5. The name of the Director, and;
6. The municipality or municipalities within which the project is to be engaged in.

And the Notice should be signed and dated by the appellant.
