Upon issuance of the environmental compliance approval, I hereby revoke Approval No(s) 6422-7YRPVH, issued on January 22, 2010.

You have applied under section 20.2 of Part II.1 of the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. E. 19 (Environmental Protection Act) for approval of:

- one (1) cross-draft paint spray booth, measuring 5.49 metres wide × 9.75 metres long × 5.49 metres high, equipped with two (2) spray guns and one (1) back-up spray gun, and applying coatings at a maximum usage rate of 180 litres per day, discharging to the air at a maximum volumetric flow rate of 12.1 cubic metres per second through a stack (ID: 1) having an exit diameter of 1.07 metres, extending 0.4 metre above the roof and 13 metres above grade;
- one (1) abrasive blasting booth, equipped with dry-arrest filters using a maximum of 2,722 kilograms of abrasive per day, discharging horizontally to the air at a maximum volumetric flow rate of 0.95 cubic metre per second though a sidewall vent (ID: 2) having an exit diameter of 0.3 metre, located 7.5 metres above grade;
- one (1) dry plasma cutting table, equipped with a dust filtration unit, discharging horizontally to the air at a maximum volumetric flow rate of 3.6 cubic metres per second through a sidewall vent (ID: 3) having exit dimensions of 0.25 metre × 0.51 metre, located 3.7 metres above grade;
- one (1) wet plasma cutting table discharging internally to the building envelope;
- forty-three (43) welding stations, with a maximum of fourteen (14) welding stations operating at any one time, served by snorkels and a dust collector, discharging to the air at a maximum volumetric flow rate of 1.42 cubic metres per second through a stack (ID: 5) having an exit diameter of 0.45 metre, extending 1 metre above the roof and 13.6 metres above grade;
- one (1) natural gas-fired curing oven, having a maximum heat input of 215,220 kilojoules per hour, discharging horizontally to the air at a maximum volumetric flow rate of 0.94 cubic metre per second through a sidewall vent (ID: 9) having an exit diameter of 0.3 metre, located 5 metres above grade;
- one (1) exhaust system, serving the paint mixing room, discharging to the air;
- one (1) abrasive tumbler, located outside along the northeast wall of the Facility, discharging to the air;

all in accordance with the Application for Approval (Air & Noise) submitted by Les Ateliers Beau-Roc Inc., dated October 1, 2020,

and signed by Nathalie St-Pierre; the supporting information, including the Emission Summary and Dispersion Modelling Report, submitted by EXP Services Inc., dated September 2020 and signed by Ron Taylor; the Acoustic Assessment Report submitted by EXP Services Inc., dated September 2020 and signed by Ron Taylor; the additional information provided by Amir Bahadori, P.Eng., EXP Services Inc. dated May 14, 2022 and August 12, 2022; and, all other documentation associated with the Application.

## DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this environmental compliance approval, the following definitions apply:

- 1. "Approval" means this Environmental Compliance Approval, including the application and supporting documentation listed above;
- 2. "Company" means Les Ateliers Beau-Roc Inc.that is responsible for the construction or operation of the Facility and includes any successors and assigns in accordance with section 19 of the EPA;
- 3. "District Manager" means the District Manager of the appropriate local district office of the Ministry, where the Facility is geographically located;
- 4. "EPA" means the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.E.19;
- 5. "Equipment" means the [???] described in the Company's application, this Approval and in the supporting documentation submitted with the application, to the extent approved by this Approval;
- 6. "Facility" means the entire operation located on the property where the Equipment is located;
- 7. "Manual" means a document or a set of documents that provide written instructions to staff of the Company;
- 8. "Ministry" means the ministry of the government of Ontario responsible for the EPA and includes all officials, employees or other persons acting on its behalf;
- 9. "Publication NPC-300" means the Ministry Publication NPC-300, "Environmental Noise Guideline, Stationary and Transportation Sources Approval and Planning, Publication NPC-300", August 2013, as amended.

## **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

You are hereby notified that this environmental compliance approval is issued to you subject to the terms and conditions outlined below:

#### **1. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE**

- 1. The Company shall ensure that the Equipment is properly operated and maintained at all times. The Company shall:
  - a. prepare, not later than three (3) months after the date of this Approval, and update, as necessary, a Manual outlining the operating procedures and a maintenance program for the Equipment, including:
    - i. routine operating and maintenance procedures in accordance with good engineering practices and as recommended by the Equipment suppliers;
    - ii. emergency procedures, including spill clean-up procedures;
    - iii. procedures for any record keeping activities relating to operation and maintenance of the Equipment;
    - iv. all appropriate measures to minimize noise and odorous emissions from all potential sources;
    - v. procedures to minimize fugitive dust emissions from the Facility's unpaved roads and areas; and
    - vi. the frequency of inspection and replacement of the filter material in the Equipment;

b. implement the recommendations of the Manual.

#### 2. RECORD RETENTION

- 1. The Company shall retain, for a minimum of two (2) years from the date of their creation, all records and information related to or resulting from the recording activities required by this Approval, and make these records available for review by staff of the Ministry upon request. The Company shall retain:
  - a. all records on the maintenance, repair and inspection of the Equipment; and
  - b. all records of any environmental complaints, including:
    - i. a description, time and date of each incident to which the complaint relates;
    - ii. wind direction at the time of the incident to which the complaint relates; and
    - iii. a description of the measures taken to address the cause of the incident to which the complaint relates and to prevent a similar occurrence in the future.

#### **3. NOTIFICATION OF COMPLAINTS**

- 1. The Company shall notify the District Manager, in writing, of each environmental complaint within two (2) business days of the complaint. The notification shall include:
  - a. a description of the nature of the complaint; and
  - b. the time and date of the incident to which the complaint relates.

#### 4. NOISE

- 1. The Company shall, at all times, ensure that the noise emissions from the Facility comply with the limits set out in Ministry Publication NPC-300.
- 2. The Company shall restrict trucking operations to the daytime hours from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

### REASONS

The reasons for the imposition of these terms and conditions are as follows:

- 1. Condition No. 1 is included to emphasize that the Equipment must be maintained and operated according to a procedure that will result in compliance with the EPA, the Regulations and this Approval.
- 2. Condition No. 2 is included to require the Company to keep records and to provide information to staff of the Ministry so that compliance with the EPA, the Regulations and this Approval can be verified.
- 3. Condition No. 3 is included to require the Company to notify staff of the Ministry so as to assist the Ministry with the review of the site's compliance.
- 4. Condition No. 4 is included to provide the minimum performance requirements considered necessary to prevent an adverse effect resulting from the operation of the Facility and to ensure that trucking operations are not extended beyond the specific hours to prevent an adverse effect resulting from the operation of the Equipment.

## **APPEAL PROVISIONS**

In accordance with Section 139 of the *Environmental Protection Act*, you may by written notice served upon me and the Ontario Land Tribunal, within 15 days after the service of this notice, require a hearing by the Tribunal. You must also provide notice to, the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks in accordance with Section 47 of the *Environmental Bill of Rights, 1993* who will place notice of your appeal on the Environmental Registry. Section 142 of the *Environmental Protection Act* provides that the notice requiring the hearing ("the Notice") shall state:

- I. The portions of the environmental compliance approval or each term or condition in the environmental compliance approval in respect of which the hearing is required, and;
- II. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to each portion appealed.

Pursuant to subsection 139(3) of the *Environmental Protection Act*, a hearing may not be required with respect to any terms and conditions in this environmental compliance approval, if the terms and conditions are substantially the same as those contained in an approval that is amended or revoked by this environmental compliance approval.

The Notice should also include:

- I. The name of the appellant;
- II. The address of the appellant;
- III. The environmental compliance approval number;
- IV. The date of the environmental compliance approval;
- V. The name of the Director, and;
- VI. The municipality or municipalities within which the project is to be engaged in.

And the Notice should be signed and dated by the appellant.
