You have applied under section 20.2 of Part II.1 of the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. E. 19 (Environmental Protection Act) for approval of:

- one (1) dust collector, discharging into the air at a volumetric flow rate of 1.89 cubic metres per second through a stack identified as Source S3;
- one (1) MIG welder, discharging into the air at a volumetric flow rate of 0.34 cubic metre per second through a stack identified as Stack S4_5, having an exit diameter of 0.25 metre, extending 5.00 metres above the roof and 12.00 metres above grade;
- fugitive emissions from T1 welding stations, discharging passively into the air through a bay door identified as Source S6, measuring 3.20 metres wide and 3.66 metres high;
- fugitive emissions from the 832 welder, discharging passively into the air through a bay door identified as Source S7, measuring 2.59 metres wide and 2.44 metres high;
- fugitive emissions from the 906 nut welder, discharging passively into the air through a bay door identified as Source S8, measuring 3.81 metres wide and 3.66 metres high; and
- fugitive emissions from T2 welding stations, discharging passively into the air through a bay door identified as Source S9, measuring 2.59 metres wide and 6.10 metres high;

all in accordance with the Application for Approval (Air and Noise) submitted by Kingsville Stamping Limited, dated August 17, 2022 and signed by Mjay Kim, HR Manager; the supporting information, including the Emission Summary and Dispersion Modelling Report, submitted by GHD Limited, dated August 18, 2022 and signed by Jen Francis; email updates provided by Jen Francis on July 26 and August 1, 2023; email updates from Bia Chai from GHD Limited on August 4 and 9, 2023; and the Acoustic Assessment Report dated July 5, 2022 prepared by Helen Ule of Akoustik Engineering Limited.

For the purpose of this environmental compliance approval, the following definitions apply:

1. "Acoustic Assessment Report" means the report, prepared in accordance with Publication NPC-233 prepared by Helen Ule of Akoustik Engineering Limited and dated July 5, 2022 submitted in support of the application, that documents all sources of noise emissions and Noise Control Measures present at the Facility.
2. "Approval" means this Environmental Compliance Approval, including the application and supporting documentation listed above;
3. "Company" means Kingsville Stamping Limited that is responsible for the construction or operation of the Facility and includes any successors and assigns in accordance with section 19 of the EPA;
4. "District Manager" means the District Manager of the appropriate local district office of the Ministry, where the Facility is geographically located;
5. "EPA" means the *Environmental Protection Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c.E.19;
6. "Equipment" means the equipment described in the Company's application, this Approval and in the supporting documentation submitted with the application, to the extent approved by this Approval;
7. "Facility" means the entire operation located on the property where the Equipment is located;
8. "Manual" means a document or a set of documents that provide written instructions to staff of the Company;
9. "Ministry" means the ministry of the government of Ontario responsible for the EPA and includes all officials, employees or other persons acting on its behalf;
10. "Noise Control Measures" means measures to reduce the noise emissions from the Facility and/or Equipment including, but not limited to, silencers, acoustic louvres, enclosures, absorptive treatment, plenums and barriers. It also means the "L" shaped 4 metre high barrier described in the Acoustic Assessment Report.
11. "Publication NPC-207" means the Ministry draft technical publication "Impulse Vibration in Residential Buildings", November 1983, supplementing the Model Municipal Noise Control By-Law, Final Report, published by the Ministry, August 1978, as amended;

12. "Publication NPC-233" means the Ministry Publication NPC-233, "Information to be Submitted for Approval of Stationary Sources of Sound", October, 1995, as amended;
13. "Publication NPC-300" means the Ministry Publication NPC-300, "Environmental Noise Guideline, Stationary and Transportation Sources – Approval and Planning, Publication NPC-300", August 2013, as amended.

You are hereby notified that this environmental compliance approval is issued to you subject to the terms and conditions outlined below:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

1. The Company shall ensure that the Equipment is properly operated and maintained at all times. The Company shall:
 - a. prepare, not later than three (3) months after the date of this Approval, and update, as necessary, a Manual outlining the operating procedures and a maintenance program for the Equipment, including:
 - i. routine operating and maintenance procedures in accordance with good engineering practices and as recommended by the Equipment suppliers;
 - ii. emergency procedures, including spill clean-up procedures;
 - iii. procedures for any record keeping activities relating to operation and maintenance of the Equipment;
 - iv. all appropriate measures to minimize noise and odorous emissions from all potential sources; and
 - v. the frequency of inspection and replacement of the filter material in the Equipment;
 - b. implement the recommendations of the Manual.

2. RECORD RETENTION

1. The Company shall retain, for a minimum of two (2) years from the date of their creation, all records and information related to or resulting from the recording activities required by this Approval, and make these records available for review by staff of the Ministry upon request. The Company shall retain:
 - a. all records on the maintenance, repair and inspection of the Equipment; and
 - b. all records of any environmental complaints, including:
 - i. a description, time and date of each incident to which the complaint relates;
 - ii. wind direction at the time of the incident to which the complaint relates; and
 - iii. a description of the measures taken to address the cause of the incident to which the complaint relates and to prevent a similar occurrence in the future.

3. NOTIFICATION OF COMPLAINTS

1. The Company shall notify the District Manager, in writing, of each environmental complaint within two (2) business days of the complaint. The notification shall include:
 - a. a description of the nature of the complaint; and
 - b. the time and date of the incident to which the complaint relates.

4. NOISE

1. The Company shall:
 1. fully implement the Noise Control Measures as outlined in the Acoustic Assessment Report no later than twelve (12) months after the date of this Approval;
 2. ensure subsequent to full implementation of the Noise Control Measures that the noise emissions from the Facility comply with the limits outlined in Ministry Publication NPC-300;
 3. ensure that the Noise Control Measures are properly maintained and continue to provide the acoustical performance as outlined in the Acoustic Assessment Report; and
 4. restrict operation of the dust collector to the daytime hours of 7:00 am to 7:00 pm.
2. The Company shall, at all times, ensure that the vibration emissions from the Facility comply with the limits set out in Ministry Publication NPC-207.

The reasons for the imposition of these terms and conditions are as follows:

1. Condition No. 1 is included to emphasize that the Equipment must be maintained and operated according to a procedure that will result in compliance with the EPA, the Regulations and this Approval.
2. Condition No. 2 is included to require the Company to keep records and to provide information to staff of the Ministry so that compliance with the EPA, the Regulations and this Approval can be verified.
3. Condition No. 3 is included to require the Company to notify staff of the Ministry so as to assist the Ministry with the review of the site's compliance.
4. Condition No. 4 is included to provide the minimum performance requirements considered necessary to prevent an adverse effect resulting from the operation of the Facility.

Upon issuance of the environmental compliance approval, I hereby revoke Approval No(s). 5144-9FTP6C issued on August 22, 2016.

In accordance with Section 139 of the *Environmental Protection Act*, you may by written notice served upon me, the Ontario Land Tribunal and in accordance with Section 47 of the *Environmental Bill of Rights*, 1993, the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks, within 15 days after receipt of this notice, require a hearing by the Tribunal. The Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks will place notice of your appeal on the Environmental Registry. Section 142 of the *Environmental Protection Act* provides that the notice requiring the hearing ("the Notice") shall state:

- a. The portions of the environmental compliance approval or each term or condition in the environmental compliance approval in respect of which the hearing is required, and;
- b. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to each portion appealed.

Pursuant to subsection 139(3) of the *Environmental Protection Act*, a hearing may not be required with respect to any terms and conditions in this environmental compliance approval, if the terms and conditions are substantially the same as those contained in an approval that is amended or revoked by this environmental compliance approval.

The Notice should also include:

1. The name of the appellant;
2. The address of the appellant;
3. The environmental compliance approval number;
4. The date of the environmental compliance approval;
5. The name of the Director, and;
6. The municipality or municipalities within which the project is to be engaged in.

And the Notice should be signed and dated by the appellant.
