Upon issuance of the environmental compliance approval, I hereby revoke Approval No(s) 7943-54QK3Z, issued on November 22, 2001.

You have applied under section 20.2 of Part II.1 of the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. E. 19 (Environmental Protection Act) for approval of:

- one (1) exhaust fan, discharging to the atmosphere at a volumetric flowrate of 9.4 cubic metres per second, through a stack having an exit diameter of 1.83 metres, extending 2.0 metres above the roof and 8.2 metres above grade, serving the following:
 - two (2) chrome plating tanks, with capacities of 10,000 litres and 2,500 litres, with emissions controlled by one (1) horizontal wet scrubber, having a cross section of 2.0 metres by 1.8 metres, a scrubber length of 3.5 metres and a multi-layer type packing, using a maximum water scrubbing flow rate of 3.95 litres per second in 3 stages, equipped with a polypropylene B-Gon mist eliminator;
 - one (1) caustic strip tank for cleaning, equipped with a mist eliminator;
- one (1) exhaust fan, discharging to the atmosphere at a maximum volumetric flowrate of 2.75 cubic metre per second, through a horizontal exhaust having an exit diameter of 0.46 metre, extending 0.5 metre above the roof and 7.0 metres above grade, serving the following:
 - one (1) dust collector controlling emissions from abrasive blasting;
 - one (1) dust collector controlling emissions from the machining area consisting of 6 cylindrical grinding machines, 2 lathes and 1 polisher;
- solvent cleaning operations exhausting internally;
- spot welding;

all in accordance with the Environmental Compliance Approval application submitted by Masterchrome Co. Ltd., dated February 10, 2023 and signed by Jovany Grez, Operations Manager; the supporting information, including the Emission Summary and Dispersion Modelling Report, submitted by ORTECH Consulting Ind., dated January 31, 2023 and signed by Ibrahim Syed; additional information provided by Ibrahim Syed and dated August 28, 2023 and September 28, 2023; Acoustic Assessment submitted by LEA Consulting Ltd., dated February 7, 2023, and signed by Daniel Eduardo Adarve Villanueva, P.Eng.; and, all other documentation associated with the Application.

DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this environmental compliance approval, the following definitions apply:

- 1. "Approval" means this Environmental Compliance Approval, including the application and supporting documentation listed above;
- 2. "Company" means Masterchrome Co. Ltd. that is responsible for the construction or operation of the Facility and includes any successors and assigns in accordance with section 19 of the EPA;
- 3. "District Manager" means the District Manager of the appropriate local district office of the Ministry, where the Facility is geographically located;
- 4. "EPA" means the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.E.19;
- 5. "Equipment" means the equipment and processes described in the Company's application, the Technical Standard(s) for which the Company is registered on the Technical Standards Registry, this Approval and in the supporting documentation submitted with the application, to the extent approved by this Approval;
- 6. "Facility" means the entire operation located on the property where the Equipment is located;
- 7. "Manual" means a document or a set of documents that provide written instructions to staff of the Company;
- 8. "Ministry" means the ministry of the government of Ontario responsible for the EPA and includes all officials, employees or other persons acting on its behalf;
- 9. "Publication NPC-300" means the Ministry Publication NPC-300, "Environmental Noise Guideline, Stationary and Transportation Sources Approval and Planning, Publication NPC-300", August 2013, as amended.
- 10. "Technical Standard" has the same meaning as in section 1 of O. Reg. 419/05;
- 11. "Technical Standards Registry" means the Ministry's Technical Standards Registry Air Pollution for Technical Standard registrations described in section 39 of O. Reg. 419/05 made under the EPA;

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

You are hereby notified that this environmental compliance approval is issued to you subject to the terms and conditions outlined below:

1. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

- 1. The Company shall ensure that the Equipment is properly operated and maintained at all times. The Company shall:
 - a. prepare, not later than three (3) months after the date of this Approval, and update, as necessary, a Manual outlining the operating procedures and a maintenance program for the Equipment, including:
 - i. routine operating and maintenance procedures in accordance with good engineering practices and as recommended by the Equipment suppliers;
 - ii. emergency procedures, including spill clean-up procedures;
 - iii. procedures for any record keeping activities relating to operation and maintenance of the Equipment;
 - iv. all appropriate measures to minimize noise and odorous emissions from all potential sources; and
 - v. the frequency of inspection and replacement of the filter material in the Equipment;
 - b. implement the recommendations of the Manual.

2. RECORD RETENTION

- 1. The Company shall retain, for a minimum of two (2) years from the date of their creation, all records and information related to or resulting from the recording activities required by this Approval, and make these records available for review by staff of the Ministry upon request. The Company shall retain:
 - a. all records on the maintenance, repair and inspection of the Equipment; and
 - b. all records of any environmental complaints, including:
 - i. a description, time and date of each incident to which the complaint relates;
 - ii. wind direction at the time of the incident to which the complaint relates; and
 - iii. a description of the measures taken to address the cause of the incident to which the complaint relates and to prevent a similar occurrence in the future.

3. NOTIFICATION OF COMPLAINTS

- 1. The Company shall notify the District Manager, in writing, of each environmental complaint within two (2) business days of the complaint. The notification shall include:
 - a. a description of the nature of the complaint; and
 - b. the time and date of the incident to which the complaint relates.

4. NOISE

1. The Company shall, at all times, ensure that the noise emissions from the Facility comply with the limits set out in Ministry Publication NPC-300.

REASONS

The reasons for the imposition of these terms and conditions are as follows:

- 1. Condition No. 1 is included to emphasize that the Equipment must be maintained and operated according to a procedure that will result in compliance with the EPA, the Regulations and this Approval.
- 2. Condition No. 2 is included to require the Company to keep records and to provide information to staff of the Ministry so that compliance with the EPA, the Regulations and this Approval can be verified.
- 3. Condition No. 3 is included to require the Company to notify staff of the Ministry so as to assist the Ministry with the review of the site's compliance.
- 4. Condition No. 4 is included to provide the minimum performance requirements considered necessary to prevent an adverse effect resulting from the operation of the Facility.

APPEAL PROVISIONS

In accordance with Section 139 of the *Environmental Protection Act*, you may by written notice served upon me and the Ontario Land Tribunal, within 15 days after the service of this notice, require a hearing by the Tribunal. You must also provide notice to, the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks in accordance with Section 47 of the *Environmental Bill of Rights, 1993* who will place notice of your appeal on the Environmental Registry. Section 142 of the *Environmental Protection Act* provides that the notice requiring the hearing ("the Notice") shall state:

- I. The portions of the environmental compliance approval or each term or condition in the environmental compliance approval in respect of which the hearing is required, and;
- II. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to each portion appealed.

Pursuant to subsection 139(3) of the *Environmental Protection Act*, a hearing may not be required with respect to any terms and conditions in this environmental compliance approval, if the terms and conditions are substantially the same as those contained in an approval that is amended or revoked by this environmental compliance approval.

The Notice should also include:

- I. The name of the appellant;
- II. The address of the appellant;
- III. The environmental compliance approval number;
- IV. The date of the environmental compliance approval;
- V. The name of the Director, and;
- VI. The municipality or municipalities within which the project is to be engaged in.

And the Notice should be signed and dated by the appellant.
