But we *can't* live without clean freshwater. It's our most valuable resource!








Leaking landfills could mean a future of bottled water for all, more plastic waste, higher municipal taxes or, possibly, a lifetime of poor health for you and your family

# **Groundwater contamination risk**



#### A clear and future threat to the Thames River






Committed to a healthy and vital Thames River

- \* 108 million litres of treated leachate pumped annually into the Thames from the Beachville landfill. That's 13.2 cubic metres every hour! Who will monitor it?
- Who will maintain the leachate treatment plant after the dump has closed and Walker has departed?
- If the dump liner leaks or the leachate treatment plant fails the Thames would become an open sewer. Who pays for the cleanup? Not Walker, but local taxpayers!



# Much too risky!



Continued blasting close to the dump will repeatedly impact the liner over the long term and potentially shorten its life

Building landfills over 30m deep on fractured rock with continuous groundwater flow allows any leachate escape to migrate quickly to drinking water wells and nearby rivers

Any escaping dump leachate could contain benzene, cadmium, chlorides, lead, 1,4 dichlorobenzene, dichloromethane, toluene and vinyl chloride plus additional toxins

Quarry blasting is considered a cause of structural property damage in Beachville and Ingersoll

# What goes into many landfills is a mystery



#### But what comes out isn't!

- ❖ Methane and carbon dioxide potent greenhouse gases
- Ozone gas potentially corrosive and injures respiratory systems
- Ferrous nano particles suspected as a contributor to brain disease
- Dust and particulates negatively effects respiratory, cardiac and brain health
- Asbestos from illegal truck brake linings causes mesothelioma in lungs
- Noise from truck exhaust brakes, backup alarms and slamming tailgates
- Uncontrolled leachate from dump liner failure and poor site management
- ❖ Developer profits at the long-term risk to local taxpayers

#### Highway 401 - Toronto's garbage chute





Let's keep our highways open for valuable, time sensitive freight. Abusing public highways by shipping low value garbage:

- Increases taxpayer funded maintenance costs.
- Burdens emergency services.
- Requires higher capacity intersections.

Imagine another 340 daily truck journeys on Oxford's roads and Highway 401 for the next 20 years or more




- More greenhouse gas and particulates in the air we breathe.


## The Right to Decide – we are not a willing host Add your voice!

- Now, let's stop it, once and for all!


