On behalf of the City of Barrie's Environmental Compliance and Risk Management Branches (City), we respectfully submit the following response to the Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks' Environmental Registry Posting Number 019-5256. The notice was posted on March 23, 2022 for a 45-day review period. City staff have undertaken a review of the proposal details and would like to provide the following comments and concerns.

- 1. Will this additional storage have any changes to the amount of solid hazardous waste accepted to the Site or shipped from the Site?
- Section 3.3(b) of ECA #A620200 does not specify the limits for solid hazardous waste.
 - a. What is the total solid hazardous waste to be stored on the Site?
 - b. Can it be clearly identified and listed in this Section of the ECA?

- 3. Section 3.2 of the ECA states that the Site is approved to receive waste generated in Canada and the United States but the proposal description states the Site will serve the province of Ontario. Is this condition changing or was the ERO Proposal description incorrect?
- 4. Section 3.5(c) specifies a spill storage volume of 110% of the capacity of the largest storage vessel or piece of equipment for each contaminant area. The City would prefer this to be increased to 120%.
